Pray In May Assembly – 5-7 year olds

This assembly will allow pupils to explore the importance of Mary as the mother of Jesus and the different ways we can pray.

It will also introduce the work of Mary's Meals and how pupils can support this through prayer.

You will need copies of the script for each reader (one adult and up to four pupils, if it is suitable for pupils to read). Otherwise, older pupils could take part to read for the younger ones.

Or you could contact Mary's Meals to ask if there is a volunteer available to lead the assemblies for you. You will also need to be able to display the PowerPoint presentation.

Slide	Wording	Discussion points
Insert here a picture of your school or school badge	Adult: Welcome to our assembly today where I am going to ask you to help me with something please. To start with though, can anyone tell me what their favourite thing about our school is?	Ask children to share their answers.
	Adult: One of my favourite things about our school is the school lunches! Hands up if you have school meals? Does anyone have a packed lunch? What would happen if we forgot our school lunch? How do we feel if we haven't had anything to eat?	Ask children to share their answers.

This assembly can take 10 to 15 minutes.

may's b a sing to w	Pupil 1: This man is called Magnus, and he thinks it is very important that all children get a nutritious meal when they are at school.	
Malayi	Pupil 2: This is because Magnus met this lady, Emma, and her children when he was visiting a country in Africa and found out that children there weren't going to school because there were no school meals.	
	Pupil 3 (if possible): So, Magnus started a charity called Mary's Meals to help make sure children get food when they go to school. But why is it called Mary's Meals?	Ask children to share their answers.
	Adult: Who do we think this lady is? Why is she important? Mary said yes to God – the angel came to ask the question. (If pupils know about the Angel Gabriel it would be good to revisit this knowledge here by asking if they know this story and what the angel was called).	Ask children to share their answers – and try to tease out that she was Jesus' mother.

10-year-old Ruby, from Yemen	Pupil 4: These special prayers help children like Ruby who is 10 years old and lives in Yemen.	
	Ruby eats Mary's Meals in school and she says that so many more children come to class now that they can eat lunch and have enough energy for the day.	
Resources	Adult: Throughout this month we'll work on some activities to help us think about Pray In May and the children who eat Mary's Meals.	Show children the different resources if you have them to hand.

VIDEO CLIP	Adult: Who can remind me how we said we feel when we are hungry? When children like Ruby have their lunch, this is how much energy it gives to them! This is two little nursery girls at a school in Malawi after they have had their Mary's Meals lunch.	Ask children to share their answers.
	Adult: At the beginning I said I wanted to ask you to help me with something. Would you please help me by saying prayers in May, asking Jesus to help children like Ruby and those two little girls we saw dancing?	Finish with a prayer that the children know.
