




MARY'S MEALS SCHOOLS AWARD: TEACHER'S GUIDE



WELCOME TO THE MARY'S MEALS SCHOOLS AWARD!



WHY TAKE PART?

By participating in the Mary's Meals Schools Award, your school becomes part of a global movement that is helping children access food and education. You will inspire your students to think globally, act locally, and understand the difference lots of acts of kindness can make to children in some of the world's poorest communities.



HOW THE SCHOOLS AWARD WORKS

The Mary's Meals Schools Award is built around three key pillars: **Commitment**, **Action**, and **Impact**. These pillars will guide your school as you work toward one of three levels of recognition: **Bronze**, **Silver**, or **Gold**.

To achieve an award, schools must:

- Complete the **essential activity** for each pillar for your chosen award level
- Select and complete two optional activities for each pillar from the provided list
- Submit your work by filling out a simple table, adding a brief description of your activities, attaching photographic evidence of each activity, and sending it to your designated Mary's Meals contact

Your journey through the award is designed to be flexible and achievable, offering options that allow your school to integrate Mary's Meals into the areas where you excel, while encouraging students to learn, lead, and make a meaningful impact.





BRONZE AWARD

This level represents your school's first steps into the Mary's Meals community. It involves setting up a Mary's Meals Student Leadership Team, hosting a fundraising event, and educating your students on global issues.

	Display a Mary's Meals Jar: Place a Mary's Meals collection jar in a common area, such as the cafeteria or library, to encourage small donations from students and staff throughout the year. SILVER AWARD

At this level, your school demonstrates deeper involvement, engaging the entire school in Mary's Meals activities. You'll host two events, incorporate Mary's Meals themes into the curriculum, and more.

	Deepen Integration with Curriculum: Incorporate Mary's Meals themes into at least two subjects (e.g., geography, social studies, or home economics) for a specific term, discussing global hunger, food security, or the impact of education and link this to our mission.	Share action on website: Host a section on the school's website that regularly updates the community on the number of children fed, funds raised, and other impact metrics.	Develop a Recurring Awareness Initiative: Develop a recurring awareness initiative, such as a monthly newsletter segment, regular socia media posts or an assembly each term to keep the community engaged.

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GOLD AWARD

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Achieving Gold showcases exemplary leadership and long-term commitment. Your school will host three events throughout the year, work with the wider community, and plan for sustaining and growing your impact for years to come.

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HOW TO SUBMIT YOUR AWARD APPLICATION





After completing the required activities:

- Fill in the table provided in the application form, detailing the essential and optional activities completed and adding a brief description
- Attach photographic evidence of each activity, such as pictures of events, student projects, or school displays
- Email the completed table and evidence to your Mary's Meals contact for review

Once your submission is reviewed and approved, you will receive your award and a digital certificate to display your school's achievement!

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

How do I know which level to apply for?

You can start at the level which feels right for you and your Mary's Meals journey. Bronze is a great place to start if you're new to Mary's Meals to establish a strong foundation. If you've already been supporting Mary's Meals at your school, you might prefer to start with Silver or Gold. You can speak to your Mary's Meals contact if you need further advice on this. If starting at a higher level, you should also complete the essential activities for Bronze level.

How long does the Mary's Meals Schools Award last?

You can work through your chosen activities at your own pace. Once you have achieved the award, this will last for three years. During this period, you can choose to work towards the next award if you wish. After three years have elapsed, you should re-apply if you wish to continue referring to yourself as a Mary's Meals School.





As part of the award, I need to organize events. Can you provide ideas to help with this?

Events come in all shapes and sizes! Here are a few ideas, and you can speak to your Mary's Meals contact for further help:

- Move for Meals: organise a sponsored run, walk, cycle or dance. You could even have a pupils vs teachers football or netball match.
- Raise some Dough: baking is a great way for pupils to get creative in support of Mary's Meals. Organise a coffee morning or bake sale.
- Porridge Pledge: pupils can opt in to give up their favourite snacks for a day or a week in solidarity with hungry children, with meals consisting of plain foods like porridge and rice. This makes a great sponsored challenge.
- Film screening: Mary's Meals have some great films available to help raise awareness of our mission.
- **Get musical**: Pupils could organize a concert, talent show or battle of the bands, with attendees charged a ticket fee.
- School fun day: Organise a variety of stalls and activities, such as a raffle, used book sale, tombola and games.
