HAITI: PROVIDING A LIGHT IN THE **DARKNESS**

As gangs wreak havoc across Haiti, Mary's Meals continues to feed the children who need us.

Mary's Meals has been serving meals to hungry children in Haiti since 2006. The poorest country in the Americas, Haiti has been plaqued by extreme violence and insecurity since 2018. Daily shootings and killings dominate life, with entire areas under gang rule.

Alarmingly, recent figures suggest children make up half of gang members. Many children can't afford to go to school, so they hang around the streets, attracting the attention of the gangs. Rob Padberg, founder of one of our partners in Haiti, Bureau de Nutrition et Développement (BND), says: "They try to get the children who have nothing to do and they pay them to be their 'soldiers'. It's very difficult to aet those children out."

However, Mary's Meals is providing a light in the darkness in Haiti. Every school day, more than 180.000 children in over 580 schools are attracted off the streets and into the classroom with the promise of a good meal.

Rob's colleague, Emmline Toussaint, says: "Food is the biggest incentive. To stop [children] being in a gang, we need to focus on the poverty that is killing them."



Chantrelle Paul is a volunteer cook at a school in Haiti's capital, Port au Prince, where her son, Walker, 11, eats Mary Meals. The promise of a daily school meal brings her great relief

after she lost her business in the gang violence.

She says: "If I don't have any money, I don't have to think about what's going to happen because I know he is going to eat a good meal at school.

"The meals are one of the best things that Mary's Meals could have ever done for me and my family."

Despite the chaos in Haiti, working together with our incredible partners, we have been able to keep serving Mary's Meals in the vast majority of schools where we work. This remarkable

tenacity to keep operating is testament to the hope Chantrelle holds on to. She says: "I believe that one day things will be restored, and we'll have a better Haiti."





THREE MILLION SMILES



From 200 children in Malawi, to more than three million children today – for more than 20 years Mary's Meals has attracted children into the classroom with the promise of a school meal.

Mary's Meals is a simple idea that works. By providing a daily meal at school, hungry children are encouraged into the classroom where they can gain an education that can

provide an escape route from poverty.

Today, thanks to our incredible supporters and volunteers, more than three million children in 16 countries around the world will go to school knowing they can rely on Mary's Meals to fuel their learning and their dreams.

In schools where our daily meals are served, hunger is reduced, enrolment

increases, attendance improves, drop-out rates fall, absences dwindle, concentration in lessons is heightened, and participation levels increase.

Magnus MacFarlane-Barrow, Founder of Mary's Meals, says: "When we first began serving Mary's Meals in one small primary school in Malawi back in 2003, we could never have imagined that this would grow into a global movement now serving three million children every school day.

"This work has grown the way it has because, all over the world, people of goodwill are sharing a little of what they have, so that children can eat and go to school."

A special approach

What's special about Mary's Meals is that the programme is owned and run by local communities in the countries where we work, with food sourced locally wherever possible, to support the economy.

Our work wouldn't be possible without our incredible global movement of supporters – from the volunteers who rise with the sun to cook Mary's Meals for their children, to every penny, prayer and minute given from here in the UK. Each and every little act of love is changing the world, one school meal at a time.

Magnus continues: "We see that each time local volunteers begin to serve our school meals, using locally sourced food, hope enters in. Children begin attending school for the first time, because of the promise of a meal. And those who were previously too hungry to concentrate in class are now able to learn."



The next child waiting

Our low cost approach means that, with Mary's Meals, a hungry child can learn on a full stomach for just 10p a meal. And £19.15 can feed a child with a meal for a whole school year. Yet too many children around the world remain hungry and out of school.

Magnus says: "Whilst it is an amazing thing that this work has grown to reach three million children, the sad reality is that tens of millions of children remain hungry and out of school. This very day, in a world in which we produce more than enough food for us all, thousands of children will die of hunger-related causes.

"We invite every person of goodwill to join the Mary's Meals movement so that our vision – that every child in this world receives one daily meal in their place of education – might be realised. When we see how this simple, inexpensive intervention is helping to transform some of the world's poorest communities we have an urgent desire for it to grow faster – and a belief that it can."



Ismayila's story

Extreme weather and financial insecurity are making life in rural Malawi, where Ismayila and

his family live, unbearable. Successive failed harvests mean they have little food to put on the table. Then floods washed away their home leaving them with nothing except hunger.

Ismayila's mother, Alesi, says: "Hunger will not leave [us]. I fear that

my children will not have a good education or a good future."

But this family and their small, isolated community have been given a lifeline. As part of a recent expansion of our school feeding programme in Malawi, Mary's Meals

arrived at the local school and now its pupils, including Ismayila and his siblings, enjoy a daily school meal while they learn.

Alesi says: "I'm so happy because the school feeding programme will help our children to eat and go to class. Education is important because if, by the grace of God, they finish their education, they will get good jobs."

BREAKING DOWN BARRIERS TO GIRLS' EDUCATION



At Mary's Meals, we truly believe education is for everyone. Our school feeding programmes encourage all children to attend school and we are proud that girls make up 50% of the children who eat our school meals.

In many of the countries where we work, girls are less likely to be encouraged to go to school than their male counterparts. Poverty can force parents to choose between their children, and girls are often kept out of school to help around the house, or go to work or even be married at a young age.

By offering a daily school meal, Mary's Meals provides an incentive for parents to send their daughters to school, which can ultimately lead them out of poverty.

Mantasha, from India, is one of the girls who benefits from Mary's Meals. Life hasn't been easy for the 12-year-old, who lost her mother when she was just six years old. When her father became unable to work due to ill health, the family was forced to move

to Delhi to live with Mantasha's aunt. Mantasha's two older sisters work in garment factories to support the family, while her two younger sisters remain at home.

Mantasha says: "If my sisters are not working, there is no food at home."

Sadly, the story of girls working instead of learning is all too familiar: 119 million girls are out of school worldwide, according to the UN.

But Mary's Meals is changing the story for Mantasha. At her school in Bhalswa Dairy, the slum area where the family now lives, she eats a nutritious, hot meal every school day, giving her the energy to learn.

Mantasha says: "Only after I came here did I start to feel hope that I could be educated. I want to be a teacher and give the same hope to other children. My dream is to build a school and teach there."

Bernadette's story

Bernadette is a Primary School Teacher at the same school in Malawi where she once ate Mary's Meals

"I was one of the children from a disadvantaged background, often going to school on an empty stomach. With the arrival of Mary's Meals, things changed for the better. We no longer had to worry about hunger, and our minds were free to concentrate on our studies.

"Every time I was in the top three positions in my class, it was because of Mary's Meals. This programme provided us with the sustenance we needed to thrive in school. I owe a great deal of my success to them. Without them, I would have been at home, battling hunger. But now, I am a teacher, right here at the same school where I was once a beneficiary of the school feeding programme.

"The concept of Mary's Meals is such a good idea. It's a helping hand that lifts us up. If it wasn't for Mary's Meals I would not be here now in my job and talking to you. I believe I am one of the girls who has truly emerged from poverty."
